A ADMIRALTY ISLAND

Accessible by boat or air, Admiralty Island is located in the heart of the Tongass National Forest, the largest temperate rainforest in North America. Part of the ABC Islands group (Admiralty, Baranof and Chichagof), the island is home to 10% of Alaska's brown bears (roughly 1,600), which outnumber humans 3 to 1. Nearly 1 million acres are occupied by the Admiralty Island National Monument. This federally protected wilderness area displays rugged coastlines, alpine tundra, and lush old-growth temperate rainforest.

ANAN CREEK

Anan Creek is one of Southeast Alaska's most iconic salmon streams. Located in the Tongass National Forest near Wrangell, Alaska, the creek has long been a popular destination for bear viewing and fishing. Its crystal-clear waters are home to five species of Pacific

salmon, as well as resident Dolly Varden and cutthroat trout. The Anan Wildlife Observatory, located along the creek, provides visitors with an up-close view of the wildlife.

B BARANOFF HOT SPRINGS

Baranoff Hot Springs is a hot springs resort located in Alaska near the Kenai Peninsula. The hot springs have been known to be therapeutic and rejuvenating, with soothing minerals and temperatures reaching up to 112 degrees Fahrenheit. Visitors can relax in their natural setting and enjoy the scenery of the surrounding mountains and forests. Baranoff Hot Springs also offers cabins and amenities for those looking for a more comfortable stay.

C CHATHAM STRAIT

Chatham Strait is a marine strait located in Southeast Alaska, between the Alexander Archipelago and the mainland. It is approximately 90 miles in length, ranging between

10-20 miles in width and extending from Icy Strait in the north to Stephens Passage in the south. Chatham Strait is known for its numerous fjords and archipelagos, and is home to a wide array of sea life, including migratory salmon, orcas, and humpback whales.

CHICHAGOF ISLAND

Chichagof Island is the fifth largest island in the U.S. It is located within the Alexander Archipelago of the Alaskan panhandle. The town of Hoonah only has a population of 900, but the exquisite island is also home to a large population of coastal brown bears.

D DAWES GLACIER

Dawes Glacier is a glacier located up Endicott Arm in Alaska. It is a huge tidewater glacier, meaning it terminates in the ocean and is fed by numerous upstream glaciers. It is one of the most active glaciers in the area and produces large

ice chunks that often cause small tsunamis when they calve into the ocean. The glacier is also a popular yachting destination for those who wish to visit and view its majestic beauty.

E ENDICOTT ARM

One of the favorite but lesser-known destinations in Alaska is the Endicott Arm with Dawes Glacier and Fords Terror Wilderness. Larger cruise ships usually don't venture into the Endicott Arm, leaving you to cruise its open waters. The location is known for its rugged mountains, deep valleys, and towering waterfalls. At the head of the fjord is a tidewater glacier. Bears, deer, mountain goats, eagles, and harbor seals are often on display for visitors.

F FORDS TERROR

Ford's Terror is a natural glacier-carved fjord located in the southeastern area of Alaska's Inside Passage. This scenic and remote

area is home to a wealth of wildlife, including sea lions, bears, whales, and various seabirds. The area is also known for its spectacular views, with towering mountains and glaciers that encircle the fjord. It is an important part of the Inside Passage and offers some of the most breathtaking scenery in Southeast Alaska.

FREDRICK SOUND

Accessible only by boat or air, Fredrick Sound is surrounded by majestic snow-covered mountains of the Coast Range. These glacier-fed waters are abundant with krill and herring, making it one of the premier places to observe feeding humpback whales in summer. Other marine animals include orcas, sea lions, Dall's porpoise, and harbor seals. The sound is a busy marine passageway for both ferries and cruise ships.

G GLACIER BAY

A 3.3 million-acre treasure near Juneau, Glacier Bay National Park

offers some of the continent's most spectacular scenery and wilderness. As the original glacier diminished over the years, it left 20 separate glaciers. Eleven of them are tidewater glaciers that calve into the bay, dramatically releasing blocks of ice up to 200 feet high. The area also features a wide variety of plant life and unusual wildlife, including wolves, brown and black bears, mountain goats, moose, eagles, trumpeter swans, and seals.

H HIGH SMITH LAKE

High Smith Lake is a hidden gem located in the remote region of Alaska. Its crystal clear waters and picturesque views of the surrounding mountains make it a popular destination for fishermen, hunters, hikers, and campers. Its remoteness also gives it an untouched and wild atmosphere. High Smith Lake is a great spot for those looking for a peaceful getaway surrounded by nature.

J JUNEAU

The capital of Alaska is surrounded by natural beauty. Nearby are Tracy Arm and Endicott Arm fjords and the most famous of Juneau's ice floes, the Mendenhall Glacier. Take the cable car 1,750 feet from the cruise-ship docks to the timberline of Mt. Roberts.

K KETCHIKAN

Ketchikan is a charming small city located in Southeast Alaska. Known as "The Salmon Capital of the World," it is home to over 8,000 people, and is famed for its stunning natural beauty. Its picturesque waterfront boardwalk, Totem Heritage Center, and Creek Street are all popular tourist attractions. Ketchikan is also a major port of call for cruise ships, with over 1 million cruise ship passengers visiting each year. In addition, the city is known for its great seafood restaurants, fishing charters, and kayak tours, offer travelers a unique experience.

M MAGOUN ISLANDS

The Magoun Islands are a remote and rugged group of islands located in the Gulf of Alaska. Situated approximately 150 miles southwest of Anchorage, these islands are composed of volcanic rocks and are home to a variety of wildlife, including sea lions, sea otters, and seabirds. The islands are an important breeding ground for harbor seals. Access to the Magoun Islands is limited, and visitors must travel by boat or helicopter to reach the remote wilderness area.

MISTY FJORDS

Misty Fjords is a 2.3 million-acre wilderness area located in Southeast Alaska. It is characterized by glacially carved granite cliffs, hundreds of waterfalls, and the highest concentration of fjords in the United States. It is home to an abundance of wildlife, including bald eagles, brown and black bears, mountain goats, and river otters. The area is

also a popular tourist destination, and visitors can explore its rugged landscape by kayak, raft, and on foot.

P PAVLOV

Located in the Bethel Census Area of Alaska, Pavlov is an unincorporated community. It is mostly inhabited by native Yup'ik indigenous people and is largely isolated from the rest of the state. Pavlov has a population of around 25 people and is accessible by boat or plane as there are no roads leading to the area. It is a popular spot for fishing and hunting, as well as for bird watching.

PETERSBURG

Petersburg is located in Southeastern Alaska. It is a small fishing town and is home to the world's largest fishing fleet of seiners and trollers. It is located on the edge of the Inside Passage and has a deep natural harbor that is filled with fishing boats year round. The town offers a unique combination of

outdoor recreation, history, and culture, and is a popular destination for visitors from around the world.

PRINCE OF WALES ISLAND

Prince of Wales is the largest island in the Alexander Archipelago located in Alaska. It is part of the Tongass National Forest and is characterized by its rugged beauty and abundance of wildlife. In addition to its natural splendor, the island is also known for its rich history, having been occupied by indigenous people for centuries and later by Russian settlers in the 1700s. Today, the island is home to a variety of communities, from fishing villages to logging towns.

PYBUS BAY

Pybus Bay is a beautiful bay located 65 miles South of Juneau, Alaska, on the southeastern coast of the state. It is known for its abundance of marine life, stunning views of the nearby mountains, and its serene atmosphere. Outdoor activities such as

hiking, fishing, kayaking, and wildlife viewing are popular in and around Pybus Bay, making it an ideal spot for visitors and locals alike.

R RED BLUFF

Red Bluff is a small unincorporated community located in the state of Alaska on the Yukon River, near the border of the U.S. and Canada. The town is home to a population of about 300. A remote, rural area with a strong sense of community, Red Bluff offers a peaceful and serene setting for those looking for a quiet escape from the hustle and bustle of city life.

S SAGINAW BAY

Saginaw Bay is a large bay located on the Alaska Peninsula, near the community of Cold Bay. It is known for its rich marine life, including salmon, halibut, and a variety of seabirds. The bay is also a popular recreation destination, providing fishing and sightseeing opportunities

to the many visitors who come to explore the area each year. Saginaw Bay is a great place to experience the beauty of Alaska.

SEWARD

Seward, Alaska is a small fishing town located on the Kenai Peninsula. It is situated on Resurrection Bay, a deep fjord of the Gulf of Alaska. SITKA

Sitka is a picturesque city located in the panhandle of Alaska. Sitka

boasts beautiful views of the surrounding mountains and ocean, as well as many outdoor activities such as hiking and kayaking. The downtown area of Sitka is full of interesting shops, restaurants, and art galleries. The city is also home to numerous cultural events and festivals throughout the year, celebrating the Native American, Russian, and American influences that have shaped the city's history.

SKAGWAY

Skagway, Alaska is a charming town set in the beautiful coastal mountains of Southeast Alaska. It is an important port of call for yachts and is a major gateway to the Klondike Gold Rush National Historic Park. Skagway is rich in history, culture, and outdoor activities, and is the busiest tourist destination in the state. ST LAZARIA ISLAND

T TAKATZ BAY

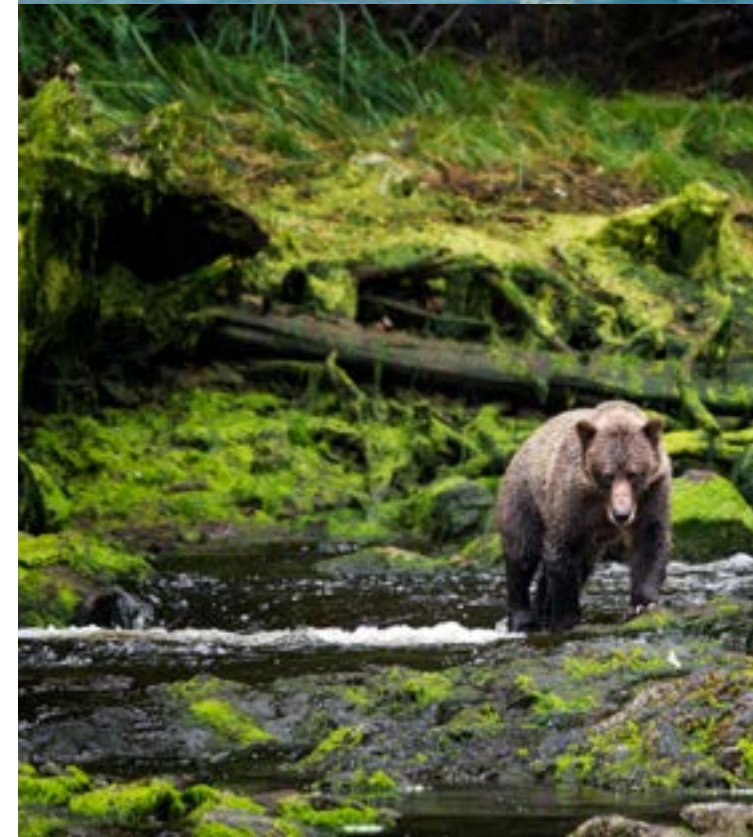
Takatz Bay is a small bay located in Southeast Alaska, near the town of Ketchikan. It is known for its spectacular views and abundant wildlife. TENAKEE INLET

Tenakee Inlet is a secluded Alaskan fjord located on Chichagof Island, a part of the Alexander Archipelago. It is nestled between towering mountain peaks and is home to the Tenakee Springs community, which consists of a unique mix of artists, fishermen, and homesteaders. Tenakee Inlet provides spectacular views of its native wildlife and landscape, including a variety of whales, porpoises, eagles, and otters.

TRACY ARM FJORD

Located 45 miles south of Juneau, the 27-mile Tracy Arm Fjord is a dramatic natural gem. In certain places, the narrow inlet is no more than a half mile wide. Cliffs rise more than 3,000 feet on either side with dramatic views of waterfalls that cascade down the steep rock walls. The twin Sawyer Glaciers, North Sawyer and South Sawyer, are located at the end of Tracy Arm.





British Columbia

With long stretches of stunning shoreline, a maze of gorgeous islands, stunning bays, inlets, and peaceful secluded coves, Desolation Sound is considered by many boaters to be one of the top cruising grounds in the world.

Unique conditions in Desolation Sound make the waters warmer than the surrounding area. This calm and sheltered area full of protected anchorages offers an unspoiled setting ideal for swimming, scuba diving, and kayaking.

The glistening waters along the Sunshine Coast offer numerous protected anchorages, views of extraordinary coastlines, and access to quaint villages where local culture can be experienced.

The unmatched feelin of wilderness in the Canadian Gulf Islands will transport you to another world, without traveling very far at all.

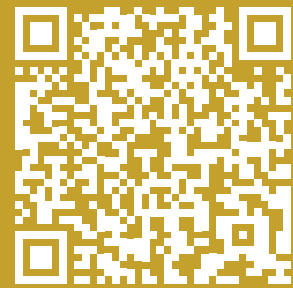

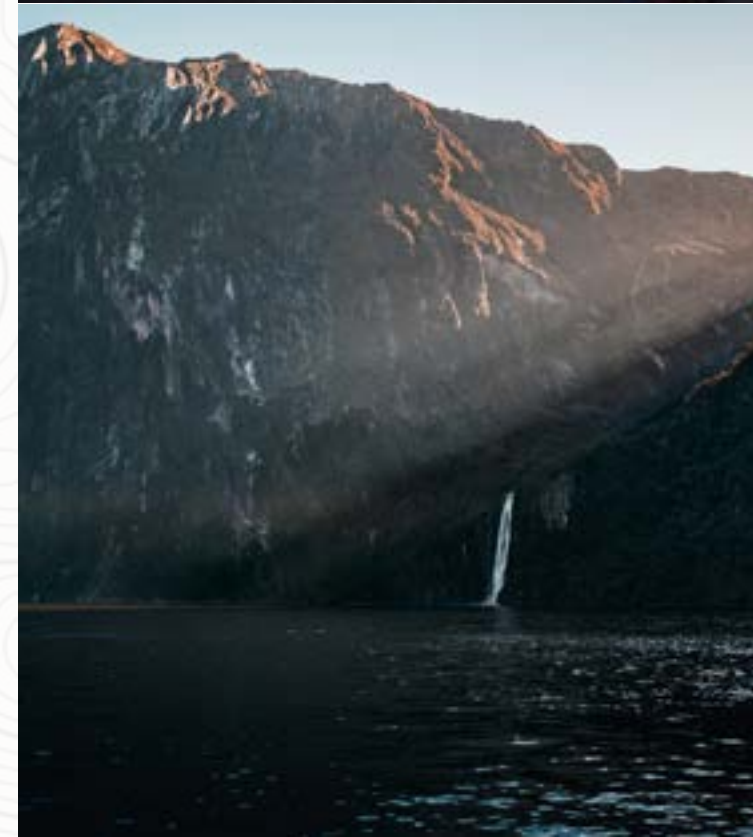

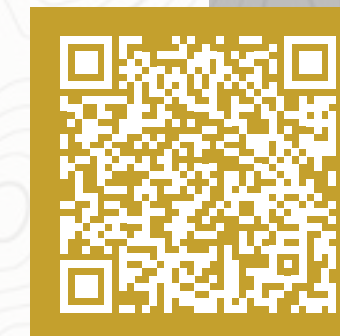

Desolation Sound is a stunningly beautiful and tranquil area in the Discovery Islands of British Columbia, Canada. The crystal clear waters, lush landscapes, and incredible wildlife draw visitors from all over the world.
